New Items Discussion:

- Scholarships

State & Local Tax (SALT) (Aaron Johnson)

- There is a general sentiment that if an affiliate is notified of anything then all affiliate companies will be barred from voluntary disclosure activities.
- There is a possibility that the WA B&O tax will be replaced with a Texas style margins tax.
 - o This is a unique situation as this is getting primary support from outside of the state
 - o This is something we could see in the Fall.
- Tax Opinion Position
 - Should there be documents drafted on the unintended consequences from Opinions sent to the DOR.
 - One of the challenges is that most of the things on which we may want to comment are proposed during the session which creates timing challenges.
 - Negotiations occur during the session due to timing.
 - Many of the proposals have intended consequences rather than unintended consequences.
 - o There are Opinion templates, but the taxation section weighs in very sparingly.
 - o To the extent any positions are broad they can be considered but we may not want to issue minority opinions.

CLE (Jason Harn & Sofia Meglioli)

- September half day CLE
 - o There was a SALT panel that might influence CLE content
 - o Mini CLEs?
 - Second week of July for the first part of a 3 part series.
 - We could use this timing for a reception or happy hour in the absence of a June annual meeting.
