SEATTLE, WA [Sept. 28, 2018] – The Washington State Bar Association (WSBA) presented the Law Offices of Carol L. Edward & Associates the 2018 APEX Award for Pro Bono and Public Service (Group). This award is presented for outstanding cumulative efforts in providing pro bono services, or for giving back in meaningful ways to the public, the community, or to the legal profession. The firm also volunteers with other area legal clinics, and works extensively with the Skagit Immigrant Rights Council, establishing information sessions and workshops to ensure that eligible individuals could renew their DACA status before the deadline. The workshops have helped hundreds of people in Skagit County stabilize their immigration status.

"Their work with DACA clients filled a need in Skagit county," said Skagit County Bar President Heather Webb. "Carol has created a law firm to make sure that people are educated about their rights, fulfill all of their dreams, and live the life they want. ... I have clients who have immigration issues; I'm so proud to be able to refer them to Carol and her staff."
